**Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP)
Internet Use Policy**

All depository libraries must offer the general public free access to online federal government information provided through the Federal Depository Program (FDLP). This follows the same principle of free access that governs the use of traditional depository materials, as provided in Section 1911 of Title 44, United States Code.

To this end:

1. Davis Library will provide access to the products in the FDLP Electronic Collection. A link to the FDLP Electronic Collection (FDsys: GPO's Federal Digital System) will be maintained on the Library's web page and will be accessible to all both on-campus and remote users.
2. Davis Library will provide access to FDLP resources to all users free of fees or restrictions, such as age or residency status. Community users who are minors may use Library workstations provided a responsible adult accompanies them. Unrestricted searching is provided to users on public OPAC workstations and users may request a "guest" login on any computer lab workstation in the Library.
3. Davis Library does not utilize, nor does it expect to utilize, filtering software, which might restrict access to official FDLP information. In the event filtering software is employed which might restrict access to FDLP information, the Library will either allow users the option to use the workstations without filtering software or it will turn off the filtering software for the user while he/she is searching FDLP information.
4. Users are not required to present identification when using public workstations. Some Library computer lab workstations may require a "guest" login that can be obtained from Library Staff at the Circulation Desk.
5. Use of all workstations in Davis Library is subject to the University's overall Acceptable Use Policy: <http://www.rio.edu/camptech/AcceptableUse-Policy.cfm>
6. Davis Library reserves the right to restrict use of its public workstations for those individuals whose use is observed to be in violation of that policy.
7. Davis Library reserves the right to charge users "usual and customary" fees for printing and/or storage media.
